Dear Little Chute Area School Parents and/or Guardians,

In light of recent events, we would like to reassure our community that the safety and well-being of our students is our top priority. Our district has adopted the ALICE program for active intruder incidents. We want to make you aware that over the past year, all faculty and staff, in conjunction with the Fox Valley Metro Police Department, were trained in ALICE protocol.

All students will receive ALICE training during 4th term of the 2017-2018 school year. High School students will receive training in April and May. Elementary, Intermediate, and Middle School students will receive training in May after Forward Exam testing. The training focuses on empowering our students and staff with an understanding of the options available to make important decisions in the event of an active intruder situation. Similar to fire drills, ALICE training is designed to take students and staff through various scenarios to better prepare their response.

ALICE stands for: **A** – Alert; **L** – Lockdown; **I** – Inform; **C** – Counter; **E** – Evacuate

The ALICE framework, in alignment with recommendations from the Federal Emergency Management Agency, provides a programmatic approach to addressing active intruder situations. This program is used by school districts, businesses, and medical facilities to enhance current best practice addressing active intruder situations. School administrators and representatives from Fox Valley Metro will continue to receive training in ALICE each year. This training instructs faculty, staff, and students with options that can be utilized if an active intruder situation occurs.
