State Report Card

Little Chute Area School District continues to "Exceed Expectations" on the DPI School Report Card and exceed the goals that have been set by the State of Wisconsin. These report cards are just one source of information about our schools that we can use to help better meet the needs of our students.

The current School Report Card is primarily based on last year's student performance, the 2018-19 school year. At the foundation of the report cards are four priority areas. Schools and districts receive a score for each area:

- <u>Student Achievement</u> proficiency in English Language Arts (ELA) and mathematics on the annual state assessments.
- <u>School Growth</u> measured by year-to-year progress in ELA and math achievement.
- <u>Closing Gaps</u> in performance between specific student groups (comparing English language learners, low-income students, students with disabilities, and members of a racial or an ethnic group with their peers).

 <u>On-Track and</u> <u>Postsecondary Readiness</u> showing reliable predictors of how many students are on-track to graduate from high school and student readiness for post-high school success.

Botz Retirement and Search For New District Administrator

At the December 9, 2019, meeting, District Administrator Dave Botz informed the school board of his intent to retire at the end of June 2020. Botz started in Little Chute in 1994 as the High School Principal. He later moved into the District Administrator role and has been serving in that position for 16 years. Throughout his tenure, the district has passed many successful referendums including the recent \$19 million referendum for the addition to and renovation of the Intermediate/ Middle/High School.

The school board is now responsible for replacing Mr. Botz. To help with this process, the School Board has retained the WASB Superintendent Search services firm. Louise Blankenheim is representing the search firm and is leading the board through the search process. The school board has already



conducted open focus groups, which provided the community, parents, and staff the opportunity to give feedback about their desired characteristics and traits of the next district administrator. The next highlight on the timeline is the application deadline of February 14. The process continues in early March with the first round of interviews for the selected candidates. The School Board is hoping to announce the final choice later in March with the new District Administrator officially assuming their duties on July 1, 2020.
