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



CONSIDERING EARLY GRADUATION?

- See your school counselor for an application
- DUE: No later than May 1 of Junior year (if graduating after 1st semester of Senior year)

- ☐ Full-time employment requires a letter from employer confirming full-time employment/hours
- Full-time enrollment requires letter from college/university or technical school confirming enrollment

CESA 6 Youth Apprenticeship

By the Numbers

- More than 3,300 students served since 2006
- · 95% placement rate following program completion
- CESA 6 currently serves 20% of the entire state enrollment in the YA program
- 11 Career Sectors and 55 Career pathways for students to obtain experience and training

The Wisconsin Youth Apprenticeship program integrates school-based and work-based learning. Students accepted into an approved Youth Apprenticeship program will continue taking classes at their high school while working as an apprentice at a participating business. Students will be enrolled in a technical class related to their youth apprenticeship program. These courses may be offered at either their high school or off campus.

CAPP & AP COURSES

CAPP

- College courses offered at the high school
- There is a <u>FEE</u> for all CAPP courses in order to receive credit
- No test required to determine credit eligibility (like AP)
- <u>STUDENTS</u> are responsible for checking transferability of courses to institutions they plan to apply to
- ■S<u>TUDENTS</u> are responsible for requesting college transcripts sent to the college they are planning to attend

AP

- Students can take an optional test in May to try to receive college credit
- There is not a fee to take the class, but there is a fee to take the AP test
- <u>STUDENTS</u> are responsible for checking transferability of courses to institutions they plan to apply to

START COLLEGE NOW & EARLY COLLEGE CREDIT PROGRAM

The deadline to submit applications for either program are as follows:

- March 1 for fall courses
- October 1 for spring courses
- * No late applications will be accepted!
- ** Applications must be filled out for EACH SEMESTER that students plan to take classes

To view courses for Start College Now (FVTC), go to www.fvtc.edu/startcollegenow *Students can ONLY take classes that are listed in the course guide!

**<u>STUDENTS</u> are responsible for choosing courses that align with their major/program, as well as making sure credits will transfer to their college of choice

TRANSFERING CREDITS

- Whether students are planning on taking:
 - CAPP courses
 - AP courses
 - Start College Now or Early College Credit Program courses

<u>Students</u> are responsible for checking the transferability of those courses!

How do I check to see if the courses I plan to take will transfer to the college/university I plan to attend?

- Call the college's Admissions Office or Registrar's Office directly (*recommended)

ACT

ACT Test Date: March 12, 2024

If students wish to retake their ACT to attempt a better score, they must register on their own through <u>ACT.org</u>, and test at a local testing center. The ACT will not be given at LCHS for retakes. Students can access their ACT scores online at ACT.org.

FREE ACT test prep: The ACT Test ACT

Students on Free and Reduced lunch can retake ACT for free. Students can see their School Counselor for a Fee Waiver.
