I have always found interest in how things are made and have also always loved building things. My dad is a residential framer, so I have always been exposed to house building. I have always enjoyed construction and had it in the back of my mind as a possible choice, but once I started to work full time during the summer, is when I realized that that is what I want to do with my life. I am still looking at the broad picture of residential construction, but hopefully, I can narrow that down in the next few years at the tech.

Currently, I am working at Eternity Builders as a cutman. We are a residential subcontractor, specializing in framing. I have worked there since summer going into junior year, and have learned so much about the trade. One of the biggest things that I learned, is that I am never done learning.

The trade has so much knowledge that has been passed down, and there is always someone that can teach you a thing or two. As I got in high school and chose to go down the medical pathway and started going on career experiences I gained more and more interest in the medical field.
