

Little Chute School Board sets referendum questions

At this week's meeting, the Little Chute School Board committed itself to asking residents approval of a \$17,770,000 renovation project on the middle/intermediate/high school campus and to continue to fund technology for another five years.

An initial resolution authorizing general obligation bonds in an amount not to exceed \$17,770,000 was approved. A second resolution authoring the school district budget to exceed the revenue limit by \$275,000 for five years for non-recurring purposes was also approved.

A resolution providing for a referendum election on the questions of

the approval \$275,000 spending resolution and the \$17,770,000 bond issue resolution was also approved. The referendum will be placed on the ballot of at the general election on April 4.

Director of Pupil Services Laura McCormick reported that there are still open enrollment spaces in kindergarten through eighth grade classes. The 4K half day sessions and high school grades are open. The Flex Academy availability is open with approval of the charter application.

There is one special education space in the early childhood class, three in the third grade class and two in the fifth grade class. All other

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special programming classes are closed. The district does provide a

waiting list for all classes.

A letter of retirement was accepted from Robert Frankenberg. Although he will be retiring at the end of the school year, he requested

to be added to the district's substitute teacher pool and would like to maintain his involvement in the theatre program, which he has helped to build over his career.
