During LMC classes throughout the school year, fifth graders learn advanced information searching techniques for locating information in the LMC and with on-line sources, including BYOC Public Library. They explore the Dewey Decimal system for library organization. Classes are planned and taught with the classroom teacher and/or the computer lab teacher.

Unit Overview

Students will refine their skills for methods of searching for and locating information sources in fiction, non-fiction and reference areas of the LMC and Internet resources. They will use the OLC (on-line catalog) features: Simple Search, Explore, Browse, Study Program, Bulletin Board and Boolean searching on the Alexandria software. They will explore organization of the Dewey Decimal system including location of reference materials.

Topic: Information Seeking Strategies

Students will use the organization of the library to locate books of personal interest in the fiction, non-fiction and reference areas of the library.

Can identify the common features of a given section in non-fiction base on Dewey Decimal categories
