During LMC classes throughout the school year, fourth grade students learn advanced skills for selecting and locating materials in the LMC. Students learn about a variety of resources that meet research and personal information needs with an emphasis on reference materials, Wisconsin authors and sources of information about Wisconsin. Classes are planned and taught with the classroom teacher and/or the computer lab teacher.

Students will refine their skills for methods of searching for and locating information sources in fiction, non-fiction and reference areas of the LMC and Internet resources. They will use the OLC (on-line catalog) features: Simple Search, Explore, Browse, Study Program and Bulletin Board on the Alexandria software. They will identify subject areas in the Dewey Decimal system which they frequently use.

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Topic: Information Seeking Strategies

Topic Overview

Students will use the organization of the library to locate books of personal interest in the fiction, non-fiction and reference areas of the library.

Applies knowledge of library organization to locate materials independently Description: Can broaden or narrow a search depending on information need Uses knowledge of Dewey Decimal numbers to locate books without use of the OLC Understands how biographies are filed in the Dewey Decimal system (921 number) Tries alternate strategies if his/her first search attempt in unsuccessful

Unit: Selection of Materials

Duration: Ongoing

Unit Overview

Students will classify and explore types of literature. They will examine methods and tools that will assist them in making choices for leisure reading. They will develop an awareness of several authors' works. They will examine a variety of sources including: Reference materials (World Almanac, encyclopedias, dictionary, Dictionary of Idioms, atlases, Wisconsin Blue Book), World Book Online, periodicals, selected Internet sites and selected search engines.

Students will distinguish between types of literature (genre) and use personal preferences to choose books.

Students will use tools to choose books at an appropriate skill level and of personal interest based on the purpose of their information search.

Identifies key words in an inquiry and chooses the best resource for the information, including reference sources Uses labeling on book to choose appropriate skill level

Students will select and evaluate information from a variety of sources and formats.

Description: Evaluates information for accuracy based on given criteria

Can distinguish between fact and opinion

Begins to apply evaluation techniques independently in person reading and research
