Grade(s) 2nd Required Course

Course Description

During LMC classes throughout the school year, second grade students learn how to select and locate materials in the library and how to evaluate print and non-print materials for topics of personal interest and for research. They will examine steps in the publishing of a book. Students come to LMC class once every four days for one half hour.

Course Details

Unit: Accessing Information Duration: Ongoing

Unit Overview

Students will develop skills for locating books in the fiction and non-fiction sections of the LMC. They will use the On-Line Catalog (Alexandria program) feature: Explore. They will identify differences between fiction and non-fiction books and differences in the organization of the fiction section (by author's last name) and non-fiction section (by subject). They will be able to use a call number to locate the book on the shelf in the LMC.

Description: Uses a shelf stick and returns books to their proper place on shelves when browsing

Students will use OLC software in a purposeful way.

Interprets information on the OLC screen

Description: Locates call #, author, title, in/out on OLC screen

Uses unique features of each type of call # to identify in which section of the library it is located



Topic: Information Seeking Strategies

Duration: Ongoing

Topic Overview

Students will use the organization of the library to locate books of personal interest in both the fiction and non-fiction areas of the library.

Learning Targets

Uses information on the OLC and call numbers to locate books
Description: Has a working knowledge of the terms: Alexandria & OLC
Uses the Explore feature of the OLC independently
Knows what a call number is and how to use it to locate a book in the LMC

Tries alternate strategies if his/her first search attempt is unsuccessful

Can find a book in the fiction or non-fiction section of the LMC using the call number with some assistance
