Course Description

During LMC classes throughout the school year, third grade students learn advanced skills for selecting and locating materials in the library and evaluating print and non-print materials for topics of personal interest and for research. Students come to LMC class once every four days for one half hour.

Unit Overview

Students will develop skills of 1)methods of searching for and 2)locating information sources. Those sources will include fiction, non-fiction, reference areas (encyclopedias, dictionaries) and Internet resources. They will use the On-Line Catalog (Alexandria program) features: Simple Search, Explore and Browse. They will identify differences between the organization of the fiction section (by author's last name) and non-fiction section (by Dewey Decimal subjects). They will improve skills needed to locate a book on the shelf in the LMC independently.
