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Ms. Lori VanHandel to Retire this Spring

Intermediate/Middle School Principal Mrs. Lori VanHandel informed the School Board in February of her plan to retire at the conclusion of the 2020-2021 school year. Mrs. VanHandel's last day in the District will be June 30, 2021.

Mrs. VanHandel began her career in education as a high school physical education and health instructor from 1987 to 1999 at Onalaska High School in Onalaska, Wisconsin. During this same time period, Ms. VanHandel was the varsity softball coach for Onalaska High School.

In 1999, Mrs. VanHandel left the classroom and moved her family to the Fox Valley where she became Assistant Principal of Horace Mann Middle School in Neenah, Wisconsin. She remained there until 2004 when she accepted the position as Little Chute Area School District's Middle School Principal.

During the past 17 years, Mrs. VanHandel has collaborated with all stakeholders associated with the success of Little Chute's intermediate/middle level students. In 2007, she was integral in a district-wide building referendum that provided students and staff with updated indoor and outdoor school facilities. In 2011, she helped guide the facilitation and implementation of an intermediate school that saw our 5th grade students move from the elementary school to the middle school campus where 5th and 6th grade students were housed together within an

intermediate school learning model. With the introduction of the Little Chute Intermediate School, Little Chute Middle School moved from serving students in 6th, 7th and 8th grade to serving students in grades 7 and 8. In 2017, she again played a critical role in reshaping the main campus learning environment when she helped guide an intermediate/middle school transformation which saw the creation of shared learning spaces throughout the main campus.

"Without a doubt this was a difficult decision as I know I will miss everyone I work with," Mrs. VanHandel told the Board of Education. "I will miss seeing the students every day. The students at Little Chute Intermediate/Middle

School are the best!" Mrs. VanHandel went on to say, "The staff at Little Chute Intermediate/Middle School consists of dedicated educators, who care about each other and the students and families that they work with. It was an honor to work alongside them during the past 17 years."

Upon retirement, she and her husband, Bob, plan to stay in the area. Their daughter will be a senior at Little Chute High School next year and is a member of the Little Chute Softball Team. Mrs. VanHandel is looking forward to having more time to golf and spend time with her family and parents at the cottage.

Mrs. VanHandel shared, "I am so appreciative of the supporting parents and community members throughout the past 17 years and proud to have been part of the Mustang Team."

Emergency Broadband Benefit

The Public Service Commission of Wisconsin and Department of Public Instruction are working together on the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) Emergency Broadband Benefit (EBB) program. The EBB program allows internet service providers to offer temporary discounts of up to \$50 per month off of eligible household's internet access bills. Low-income households may also get discounts on a laptop, desktop or tablet computer.

Households are eligible if ONE member of the household qualifies for the FCC's Lifeline program, receives free and reduced-priced school lunch, or did so in the 2019-20 school year, or is a Federal Pell Grant recipient. You also qualify if you have experienced a substantial loss of income since February 29, 2020, or you meet the eligibility criteria set by the participating internet service provider.

Enrollment is now open on the EBB website. https://fcc.gov/broadbandbenefit

The Department of Public Instruction is committed to improving digital equity in the state of Wisconsin. As part of their efforts, DPI is collaborating with Measurement Lab (M-Lab) to collect data on internet connection speeds across Wisconsin. M-Lab's internet speed test data will be used to create detailed reports and to provide maps of internet connection speeds across the state. These reports can help the Governor's Task Force on Broadband Access and other broadband task groups target initiatives to improve internet speeds statewide.

All of our clubs and organizations have continued to meet this year, giving our students opportunities for involvement. The drama department has come up with innovative ways to keep our students involved. The High School Play, *The Pandemic That Didn't Define Them*, was recently released to the public. A few notable accomplishments this year include a 5th place finish at State for the Boys Cross Country Team, Riley Huss taking 9th place at State Cross Country, and a 6th place finish at State Wrestlings for Matthew Janssen. The Dance Team competed in accordance with the Wisconsin Association of Cheer/Pom Coaches recommendations. They advanced to the state competition where they submitted recorded routines for judging and won 2021 State Champions in D4 Pom as well as 4th place in D2 Kick. Spring sports are geared up in late April and teams will compete through the month of June this year. We are so proud to have been able to offer athletics for our students this year and are pleased with how our coaches, athletes, and parents have dealt with the new guidelines that were put in place.

We are excited to share that we were able to hold an outdoor prom at Doyle Park on Saturday, May 1st. Our prom committee and prom court organized a prom that they will never forget.

This year has been nothing close to normal, but with offering extracurricular activities, we have tried to provide some normalcy for our students.
