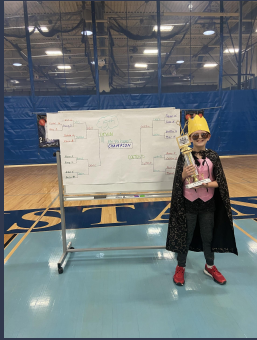

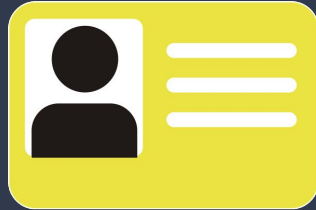

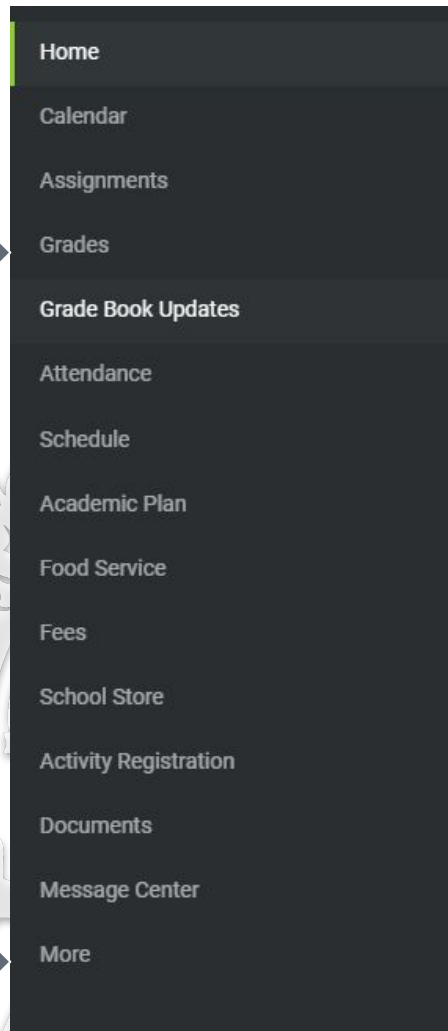

Attendance is important!

- Students who attend regularly feel more connected to their school and peers.
- A good start to the year is important in building positive momentum- “Students who missed fewer than 2 days in September continued to average fewer than 2 days absent each month.”
