#### **REGISTRATION PROCEDURE THIS YEAR**

#### 1. ENROLLMENT INFORMATION FOR FAMILIES CURRENTLY NOT ATTENDING LCASD

You will need to request enrollment into LCASD Summer School. You can find information on how to do this by going to <u>www.littlechute.k12.wi.us</u> and following the Summer School Link. If your child attended LCASD in 2023-24, you do not need to do this step.

#### 2. ENROLLMENT INFORMATION FOR ALL STUDENTS (Everyone must do this step)

Once the registration window is open (April 8-19) you may request a course/courses for your child or children. All course requests must be submitted by April 19th at noon.

#### 3. CONFIRMATION OF COURSE REQUESTS

We will place students in the courses they requested on a first come, first served basis. Please check back into your Infinite Campus Parent Portal to check on your child's schedule. We will not be sending out notification of schedules. If a student has a class period without a course, they will need to leave the building and return for their next course. We unfortunately do not have supervision for those students, please keep this in mind when scheduling. If students have a period without a class, they will need to be picked up and brought back for their next class.

#### NEED ASSISTANCE WITH ENROLLING YOUR CHILD?

Registration will not be accepted by telephone or on paper, but we will help walk you through the online process. If you need to use a computer, your local Library has computers or you can call to schedule a time to come into the office to use one of our devices.

#### **CLASS CANCELLATIONS**

A course may be canceled if there is insufficient enrollment. You will be notified by email in late May if a course is canceled. We cannot guarantee there will be other classes to fill an open time after registration closes, but will look into options for your student if a class is canceled.

#### **GENERAL REGISTRATION INFORMATION**

Registration will only be accepted online. Late registration or walk-ups will not be accepted. Students must register online to attend classes. Students should register for courses with regards to the grade they will be entering in the fall.

#### **ELIGIBILITY**

Any child whose legal residence is within the boundaries of the Little Chute Area School District\_may enroll in the Little Chute Area School District Summer School Program. With the approval of a student's home school district, enrollment is also open to any student who legally resides in any of\_the school districts belonging to the Fox Valley Summer School Consortium (Appleton, Freedom, Hilbert, Hortonville, Kaukauna, Kimberly, Little Chute, Menasha, Neenah, Oshkosh, and Shiocton).

# **Course Descriptions:**

#### Crafts to Make & Take

Students will enjoy using their imagination to express themselves through various art media and craft projects. This hands-on active class for students interested in creating their own unique masterpieces.

#### **Basketball for All**

Basketball for All will teach the fundamentals of the game. We will focus on developing dribbling, passing, and shooting skills in a fun and enjoyable environment. We will also work with helping the students to always give their best effort both on and off the court.

#### Coding

Learn block coding with Virtual Robots (VR). VEXcode VR brings real world STEM concepts to life making coding accessible and fun. Lessons will focus on basic computer science concepts while students move from beginner level activities to more intermediate/ advanced challenges.

#### **Everyday Fun**

Make everyday a day of summer fun! Activities in the class include: arts and crafts, party games, scavenger hunts, computer and board games.

#### **Games Galore**

Students will enjoy playing their favorite games and learning new games too. Each week will consist of fun, high energy activities and games that get their bodies moving, minds thinking and their hearts pumping.

#### **Getting Ready for 4K**

A shortened version of a typical 4K day including story time, art time, play, snack and playground time. Our weekly themes will be Getting to Know You, Summer Fun and ABC-123! Two course options are available for those students entering 4K in the fall.

#### **Getting Ready for 5K**

Getting students ready for 5K! Each day includes a learning activity, read-aloud, and snack revolving around a fun, age-appropriate theme. There will be additional enrichment and recess time. There are two options for those entering 5k in the fall.

#### Getting Ready for 5th Grade

Getting students ready for 5th Grade! Students will get acquainted with the Intermediate School, meet new friends, learn protocols and procedures for 5th grade and meet one of their teachers. There are two options for those entering 5th grade in the fall.

#### Just Dancin'

Does your little mustang love to move and dance? Take part in this summer school course to learn some fun moves!

#### **Math Review**

Students need a teacher recommendation to enter into this class. It will not show up as an option for parents to choose. They will be entered by our scheduler. This class will use a workshop model to focus on skill development and reinforce math concepts taught. Small group instruction, games/activities, and iReady will be components of this course. Letters were sent to parents in early April if their child was recommended for this course.

#### Fun with Math Facts

This course is designed to make math fun and engaging for students. Through a variety of interactive activities and games, students will learn important math concepts. With a focus on fun and exploration, this course is perfect for students looking to improve their math skills while enjoying their summer break.

#### **Movement Madness**

Developmentally appropriate games that promote physical activity.

#### **Movies and Projects**

Students will watch movies about friendship, honesty, bullying, and acceptance. After the movie, the students will write and talk about the lessons they learned from watching the show. Also, what is a movie without snacks? Students are encouraged to bring a water bottle to drink and snacks will be provided.

#### Mustang Theater Academy (THIS COVERS THE 9AM AND 10AM SESSIONS)

*Acting Section, 3rd-6th Grade* - As an extension of the Little Chute Theater Department, students will have the opportunity to get involved in a musical theater production of Annie Kids Edition. *Production Section, 7th-12th Grade* - Middle and High School students will learn how to produce a theater production. They will mentor young actors as they learn and perform Aladdin Kids Edition.

#### **Pixar Shorts & Themes**

Engaging in the value of identifying, discussing, and analyzing the themes of Pixar shorts. Students will watch Pixar shorts and will be led through the development of themes and their influence on the purpose of the story. Students will evaluate and synthesize the creative intent behind the Pixar shorts.

#### Sports of All Sorts

This course will include a variety of outdoor recreational games such as kickball, dodgeball, basketball, pumpkin ball, ultimate frisbee, and other summer games/activities played outside.

#### **HS Physical Education**

A physical education class geared towards exposing students to various lifetime activities. and fitness activities available today. Students in this class will have fun exploring trendy new games such as

Ladder Ball, Bean Bag Toss, Bottle Battle, Disc Golf, Indoor Tennis, Volleyball, etc. Beyond these trendy games, students will participate in lifetime fitness activities such as Yoga, Crossfit Training, Pilates, Zumba, and other fitness trends. Fitness assessments will be taken once per term. Along with activities, students will create and manage a SMART Goal during the course. Students will be expected to change for this course when appropriate. .5 credit

#### **Reading Review**

Students need a teacher recommendation to enter into this class. It will not show up as an option for parents to choose. They will be entered by our scheduler. This class will use a workshop model to focus on skill development and reinforce reading concepts taught. Small group instruction, games/activities, and iReady will be components of this course. #### **Reading Corner**

This course is designed to make reading fun and engaging for students. Through a variety of interactive activities and games, students will develop their reading comprehension, vocabulary, and critical thinking skills. By the end of the course, students will have a greater love for reading and confidence in their abilities.

#### Science is Cool!

Come explore the amazing world of science! We will use hands-on STEM activities to uncover the mysteries of science and have a great time doing it!

#### Spanish: Uno, Dos, Tres!

¡Bienvenidos! Welcome to Spanish! Come join us to conversar, hacer arte y jugar (speak, make art and play). This class introduces students to the language and culture of Spanish-speaking countries through games, music and art projects. ¡Qué divertido! ¡Olé!

#### **Robotics**

Young engineers will apply the engineering design process in this project-based STEM class. Students will use VEX robotics equipment to build and code in a variety of design challenges. 8th grade LCMS students have prior knowledge from their PLTW class and can use this as an opportunity to extend their learning.

#### Weight Training

Mustang weight training is designed to build strength and agility for all athletes. The class will take place in the weight room and outdoors. Speed, quickness and endurance will be addressed throughout the summer.

#### Wizards, Jedi & Superheroes

Enter an alternative reality! Read, write, and D.I.Y. your favorite stories: Harry Potter, Star Wars, and Comic Superheroes. Reading, writing new adventures, drawing, and creating your own wand, polly potion, light sabers, droids, and graphic comics.
